Introduction

This effect is my take on a classic of magic that utilizes the “Key Card” concept. However, we did not want to simply teach you the basics of the trick, instead we wanted to guide you in how to perform it well and take it from a “trick” to a memorable experience for your spectators. The following guide is written to accompany the instructional video:

The Effect

The spectator shuffles the deck and selects a card while your back is turned. You have your spectator(s) cut the deck several times. You then have her “project” her selected card onto the palm of your hand. You take your hand and scan it across the deck and slowly reveal the selected card.

Basic Steps

- 1) Have a spectator shuffle the deck.
- 2) Have her split the deck roughly about half and ask her to keep whichever half she desires.
- 3) You take the other half back.
- 4) You tell her that in a moment you will turn around and that once you do she is to:
 - a. Select a card from the half she is holding
 - b. Show her friends
 - c. **Place it back on top of her half**
- 5) You turn around as she selects her card as instructed in step #4.
- 6) **Secret key card glimpse:** While you are turned around, glimpse the bottom card of the half you are holding. You will have plenty of time.
- 7) They will tell you to turn back around once she is done. Once you turn back around, drop your half of the deck on top of her half. What you have essentially done is drop your key card directly on top of her selected card.
- 8) At this point all you need to do locate your memorized key card and the card to the **right** of your key card will be the spectator’s chosen card.
